Primary School Sport Funding Grant 2020-21

Objectives

- To ensure high quality achievement in PE
- To raise the quality of teaching and learning in PE
- To enhance lunchtime and after school PE provision
- To encourage increased participation in extra-curricular sports activities
- To increase the number of opportunities that all children have to participate in festivals and competitions

Summary of allocation and proposed spending 2020-21 (please see sports premium priorities document for more detailed information).

In 2020/21 the school received an allocation of £19 020. With the disruption of a second lockdown, some of the allocation was spent differently to what was anticipated. In summary funding contributed towards the following:

- Contribution towards teacher training to extend and enhance the expertise of staff when delivering PE and after school sports provision.
- Contribution towards releasing key staff to observe specialist teachers to improve practice.
- Contribution towards payment of Specialist Sports Teacher to run extra-curricular sports clubs (lunchtime and after school).
- Contribution towards a qualified Sports Teacher to provide extra-curricular clubs and CPD for staff
- Contribution towards release time of PE coordinator to monitor the quality of teaching and learning in PE.
- Contribution towards release time for PE coordinator to analyse the uptake of extracurricular physical education activities and produce an action plan to increase this
- Contribution towards PE specialist teacher accessing training
- Contribution towards the purchasing of equipment to enhance quality of PE and after school provision.
- Payment of a TLR for a lead PE teacher to coordinate and arrange additional opportunities for participation in extra-curricular competitions and festivals
- Money towards the organisation and running of virtual Festivals of Sport for our own and neighbouring schools.
- Purchasing new equipment to ensure that children in bubbles had access to equipment to aid physical activity at playtime and lunchtime.

Sustainability

In order to make these improvements sustainable, we are committed to ensuring all teachers are fully confident in delivering high quality PE lessons due to the training that they have received. The training that the lead PE teacher has undertaken will ensure that play leaders will be able to continue to provide extra opportunities for younger children at lunch time. The provision for extra-curricular clubs will continue for as long as the funding allows.
